This letter is in regard to the Jackson Point Road Bridge. This bridge is in serious condition and is weight posted such that no commercial traffic can cross the bridge. This will be year 3 of no commercial access to over 20,000 acres of timber, crop land and Oil and Gas Exploration. The loss of this bridge has taken an undue toll on timber values and much of the timber has died as a result of a high river and our inability to cut and haul it. This is the only access to over 20,000 acres in Adams and Wilkinson Counties. There are no detours or alternate routes providing access to this area. The economic losses sustained by the Counties and the affected citizens are enormous. On your last trip to Natchez I spoke with you about this at the Natchez Coffee Company and followed up with your staff.
