Dear Congressman Guest:

The Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) has reviewed the city of Madison's proposal for widening a segment of Madison Avenue to be considered for FY 2026 Congressionally Directed Spending. Subject to any required adjustments to prior agreements, this letter is to confirm:

- 1. The project is eligible for federal-aid highway funding under title 23, United States Code;
- 2. MDOT is willing to provide oversight of the project, carried out by an eligible local public agency, in accordance with federal regulations if funding is enacted; and
- 3. The project will be included in the STIP if funding is enacted.
